Wyedean Stages Rally 2025

Welcome to the Richard Cole Contracting Wyedean Stages Rally organised by the Forest of Dean Motor Club Limited.

As in past years, this event has attracted and been supported by many National & Club Championships. For 2025, we welcome competitors from the Motorsport UK Welsh Stage Rally Championship, The Motorsport UK English Stage Rally Championship, The HRCR Stage Masters Challenge, The MDMC TCS Rally Challenge incorporating the Celtic Micra Challenge, the Association of North Western Car Clubs Championship and HRCR Category 1 Cup & Mini Cup.







SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

1. ANNOUNCEMENT

Forest of Dean Motor Club will organise an Interclub Permit Special Stage Rally on Saturday 8th November 2025, with the event taking place within the Forest of Dean. First car starts at 08.00hrs and last car finishing at approximately 18.00hrs. The event will be a qualifying round of the 2025 Championships listed in SR3.

2. JURISDICTION

The competition will be held under the General Regulations of Motorsport UK. [incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the F.I.A.], these Supplementary Regulations (SR's) and any further Official Instructions that the organisers may issue for the event (NCR - Chapter 3, Appendix 10 - 1.C)

3. <u>AUTHORISATION</u>

CAO Authorisation has been applied for and will be displayed on the official notice board at the event.



4. **ELIGIBILITY**

The event is open to all holders of a valid Motorsport UK Stage Rally Competition Licence of Interclub status or higher and who are registered competitors in an invited championship or a member of a club belonging to: WAMC, ASWMC, AWMMC and ANWCC.

5. **DOCUMENTATION**

All competitors must produce a valid competition licence, a valid club membership card and where applicable, championship registration card. Please note that **both** crew members must hold a minimum Interclub Stage Rally status Motorsport UK competition licence for this event. Documentation will take place in person on Friday 7th November from 13:00-18:30hrs.

7. **EVENT FORMAT**

The event will contain 7 special stages totalling 41 miles on Forestry Commission roads, plus 92 road miles (mileages are approximate).

Cars will start at one minute intervals.

Competitors will be seeded in two groups. The first group will consist of all cars in classes 9, 10, 12, H1 & H2. This group will run in reverse order of anticipated performance. The second group will consist of all other entrants; this group will run conventionally, in order of potential performance (at the organiser's discretion).

Once a driver or co-driver has signed on, no change of crew/vehicle will be considered. The decision of the Clerk of Course will be final.

- All historic vehicles must have a Historic Rally Vehicle Identity Form (HRVIF) available for inspection. Category 3 and 4 cars must also present the appropriate homologation form, or any other documentation listed in the Motorsport NCR's. Only period modifications used in rallying on the make and model of car are permitted.
- Historic Rally Cars that comply with FIA Appendix K regulations may score points in the corresponding category periods and engine size/configurations. These cars must have a valid FIA Historic Technical Passport (FIA HTP).



- Road rally class will be permitted to allow cars to run under Motorsport UK stage rally rules for tyres and graphics. In the need for auxiliary lighting then follow Motorsport UK stage rally rules.
- Forced induction engines and Rotary engines will have their capacity multiplied by 1.7 in line with FIA regulations.
- All vehicles MUST comply with the Motorsport UK Technical Regulations (NCR Chapter 7 1 1.1 and NCR Chapter 13 Appendix 15/16/17 as applicable)
- In addition to stage safety regulations (See NCR Chapter 13), All vehicles must conform to Motorsport UK tyre regulations as defined in (NCR Chapter 8 Appendix 4) Permitted Tyres.
- All vehicles MUST be taxed for use on the public highway and possess a valid MOT certificate (if applicable) and a Motorsport UK rally car log book / vehicle passport, (NCR Chapter 13 Appendix 16)
- All vehicles must comply with (NCR Chapter 13, Appendix 1, Section 7 Noise testing) Any
 vehicle that produces "excessive noise" will be immediately disqualified.

9. AWARDS

Awards will be presented at the finish in the Service Area.

Upon publication of final instructions, the organisers reserve the right to amalgamate classes if they deem it necessary.

Additional awards may be presented at the organisers' discretion. Perpetual awards remain the property of Forest of Dean Motor Club Ltd and must be returned on request.

10. ENTRIES

Entries open at 19.00 hrs on Monday 22nd September 2025 and closes for seeding at 20.00 on Monday 27th October 2025.

Entries will finally close on Tuesday 4th November 2025 at 20.00.

The maximum entry for the event is 90. The minimum entry is 70. The minimum numbers in each class being 5. Should any of the minimum figures not be reached then the organisers reserves the right to reduce stage mileage, cancel the event or amalgamate the classes as necessary.

- The entry fee is £844.00 (£799.00 + £45.00 for tracker) which includes £5.00 environmental/carbon footprint offsetting fee.
- All entries must be made on the electronic entry form published and must be accompanied by the appropriate entry fee.
- All payments are to be made by Bank Transfer, please use the account details shown on the electronic entry form. Both the driver and co-drivers surname must be added in the appropriate box on the electronic payment as a point of reference.
- No entries will be accepted until payment appears into the official bank account.
- No entries will be accepted by telephone.
- Entry acknowledgement, entry acceptance, final instructions and final results will be emailed.
- A valid email address is needed on the electronic entry form.
- Entries will be accepted in order of receipt with full payment.
- The completed entry must contain the name and address of your insurers for the non-competitive sections of the event run on the public highway, unless you are using the Kingfisher Motorsport Insurance Event Road Section Insurance Scheme.



- Any vehicle that fails Scrutineering or Noise or fails to start the event, will NOT receive a refund.
- Once a competitor has made an entry on the on-line entry form and has had that entry acknowledged AND has paid in full then no changes to an on-line entry (car, driver, co-driver) can be made without the organiser's permission.
- The organisers reserve the right to refuse an entry, should they wish to do so.

Entry fees will only be refunded as follows: (NCR Chapter 6 Appendix 1 Section 11).

- Cancellation of entries received, in writing, or via email before Monday 27th October 2025 at 20.00hrs will be refunded, less an administration fee of £25.00. No cancellation accepted by telephone.
- Cancellation of entries received, in writing, or via email after Monday 27th October 2025 at 20.00hrs and up to the Tuesday 4th November 2025 for entries as detailed above will be entitled to a refund of their entry fee less £75.00 to cover administration and expenses. No cancellation will be accepted by telephone.
- Entries cancelled after the close of entries will receive no refund, unless the entry can be filled by a reserve.
- If the event is cancelled all entry fees received will be refunded in full.
- No other refunds will be considered.

Final instructions will be available via Sportity App and via event webpage on Saturday 1st November 2025 and will carry the same force as these S.R's. Your road book, time cards and service pack will be provided for collection at documentation.

Data Processing

Competitors are advised that information they provide will be stored electronically and will only be used for the following reasons:

- The organisation of the Wyedean Stages 2025.
- Sending information competitors information regarding future Wyedean Rally Events.

If you do not wish your information to be used for purpose (b) above, then please tick the relevant box on the entry form.

Car Tracking

In association with Sporttrax and Onthepacenote.com, the rally will operate a GPRS/GPS safety tracking system that will enable the speed and position of each competing car to be monitored and logged.

At scrutineering, all cars will be fitted with a tracking device that will remain active throughout the event. This must be retained in the car until the finish, where it will be removed by the system providers. If a competitor retires during the event, the device must be returned with the damage declaration form OR handed to the Sweeper car.

Failure to return the equipment will result in the driver being invoiced for its replacement.

This rally car tracking is in addition to (or supplemental) to primary (existing) safety regulations covered through the GR and SR's

12. RESULTS

Interim & Partial results will be displayed at intervals during the event and Provisional Results as soon as possible after the event on the official notice board, located on the Sportity App. Any protest must be lodged in accordance with (NCR Chapter 2 Appendix 9)

Live results will be available online courtesy of AMC Rally Results.

13. ROUTE

- The route is covered by Ordnance survey map (1:50000) 162. Entrants will be supplied with a Road Book and time cards at rally headquarters provided the necessary documentation details are completed. These documents will provide competitors with the necessary information to enable them to comply with NCR Chapter 13, Appendix 2, Section 2.9.
- Subjective Route Notes for the Wyedean Stages Rally are permitted (NCR Chapter 13 Appendix 10 Section 7.42) and will be available from Patterson Pacenotes or ONTHEPACEnote.co.uk Please see adverts elsewhere in the regulations for contact details.
- No other route notes are authorised for use on this event, and if found will be penalised in accordance with (NCR Chapter 13). Competitors are advised that the organisers accept no liability or responsibility for the use of the Subjective Route notes.
- The event will employ the use of **Red Flags** in line with Motorsport UK regulations (NCR Chapter 13 Appendix 2 Section 4.17 and NCR Chapter 13 Appendix 2 Section 7.31)
- The route will be split into three legs, with a maximum lateness between two consecutive main time controls (MTC) being fifteen minutes.
- Service will only be allowed in the designated area at designated times. No management cars are allowed. Any crew seen to be utilising a management car by an appointed Judge of Fact will be disqualified under (Chapter 13 Appendix 14).
- The route will be divided into three competitive legs, legs 1 & 3 containing two special stages each, with leg 2 containing three special stages. At the end of each of these legs will be a Main Time Control [MTC], these are to ensure that the event runs to time. Penalties will be applied for every minute late or early, as well as maximum lateness.


14. <u>IDENTIFICATION</u>

Competitors will be identified by 23cm high black (B) competition numbers as defined in the Motorsport NCR rules (NCR Chapter 7 Appendix 10 – Section 1.1 c). These numbers must be displayed on the two front doors of the competing vehicle in a defined white door square. This will be enforced at scrutineering. These numbers will be supplied by the organisers. Competitors must make available to the organisers an area approximately 450mm x 130mm for event decals (A) on each side of the vehicle, above the competition number. With the permission of the Clerk of the Course, these decals can be placed adjacent to the competitor's numbers.

In the interest of safety, additional high visibility side window numbers (C) will be issued to competitors by the organisers. These numbers must be positioned in the top front corner of the rear side windows. A further black competition number on a white background (D) must be displayed on the rear window of the competing car.

15. PENALTIES

Penalties will be as detailed in the NCR Chapter 13 (Appendix 14 Section 1), except as modified below:

- Not reporting or reporting OTL at a control Disqualification
- Contravention of the General Regulations or SR's Disqualification
- Violation of out of bounds areas Disqualification

16. JUDGES OF FACT

Named Judges of Fact will be appointed (NCR Chapter 5 Section 21 and NCR Chapter 13 Appendix 2 Section 4.40) as per the list displayed on the Official Notice Board prior to the start of the event.

These will be appointed by the organisers and will be on duty throughout the event to observe and report any competitor considered to be in contravention of the Regulations and to adjudicate on the items as set out in (NCR Chapter 13).

Driving Standards Observers may be appointed in accordance with (NCR Chapter 13, Appendix 2 Section 3.7). The named start officials on Special Stages will be empowered to judge whether a competitor has made a false start.

17. <u>TIMING</u>

The Rally will be divided into link sections and special stages. All controls will be time controls (TC). Each link section will be allotted a target time based upon a maximum of 25 MPH average speed and a competitor can calculate their due time of arrival at the next TC by adding the target time to their actual time of departure from the preceding TC. However excessive lateness taken over target on link sections and special stages is cumulative and, once lost, cannot be regained. When accumulated lateness between any two consecutive main controls (MTC) exceeds fifteen minutes, a competitor will be disqualified from the event before the next MTC. Lateness MUST be absorbed at service and rest halts. The minimum Service Time will be 20 minutes. See also (NCR Chapter 13 Appendix 13 Section 10). At the end of the rally competitors are allowed to check in in advance of their due time. Competitors arriving early must have their **due time** recorded on their time card.

These controls will be situated at each end of the competitive legs. Competitors leaving MTC * out at 1 per minute.

SPECIAL STAGE ARRIVAL CONTROLS [ATC]

Please read (NCR Chapter 13 Appendix 13 Section 3) At this Time Control, the marshal will enter the competitor's time of arrival and the provisional starting time for the special stage which must be a minimum of 3 minutes after the arrival time in order to allow the crew to prepare for the stage. The area between the Special Stage Arrival Control and the Stage Start is Parc Ferme. At the Special Stage start the marshal will enter the actual start time which will normally correspond with the provisional start time. The start will then be given in accordance with (NCR Chapter 13 Appendix 10 Section 7.36 or 7.37).

SPECIAL STAGE START CONTROLS [STC]

At an STC competitors will be given an actual start time in Hours, Minutes and Seconds (in theory the same time as provisionally issued by the arrival control). When a competitor has booked into an ATC, a start marshal will assume that they are ready to start the stage and will issue a start time as soon as the start line is cleared, whether the competitor is ready to start or not. The marshal will either manually or electronically (LED Lights) inform the competitor at 15 secs, 10 secs, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1, GO. LED light sequence, with 15 seconds to go the red light comes on, with 10 seconds to go, red light stays on and 5 amber lights come on. With 5 seconds to go red light goes out. From 5 seconds to zero the amber lights count down the last 5 seconds. At zero the green light comes on to signal the start. The start will then be given in accordance with (NCR Chapter 13 Appendix 10 Section 7.36)

As each section is timed separately, the time taken between ATC & STC is dead time and delays are automatically allowed for. The area between ATC & STC will be **PARC FERME**.

SPECIAL STAGE FINISH CONTROLS [FTC]

At the FTC, a competitor will receive their special stage finish time [time crossing the flying finish line] in Hours, Minutes & Seconds. This time, less seconds, will be their start time for the next road section. Any competitor that fails to stop at the stop line must not, under pain of exclusion, reverse to the control, they **MUST** return on foot. Should any time not be legible or appear not to be authentic, on a competitors time card, the organisers may use any means available to them to establish a time. It is the competitor's responsibility to ensure that their times are recorded correctly and handed in when required. Once a competitor has accepted a time no further claims will be considered without an official query form. Any correction or amendment to the time card without approval by the timekeeper will result in disqualification.

PASSAGE CONTROL CARD COLLECTION [PC]

These controls will be used to collect time cards during each leg and will be indicated at certain points in the road book. Penalty as per (NCR Chapter 13 Appendix 14 Section 1)









18. SERVICING

The use of Motorhomes, Caravans and tents for overnight camping is **NOT** allowed in the service area. All trailers must be stored in the designated trailer park, location as detailed in final instructions.

No management cars are allowed on the event.

Service will take place at the Ross Livestock Market, Ross on Wye, which will be indicated in final instructions. Only one service vehicle and the competing car will be allowed into the service area.

The use <u>on the day</u> of Motor Homes or the use of trailers for servicing is by **prior arrangement only** with the entries secretary. Competitors must supply a **good quality impervious** ground sheet, which must be placed under the competing vehicle during service to protect the surface from spillage. Any oil spills must be cleaned up using appropriate materials.

The use of Motorcycles, Mopeds, Bicycles and Scooters is not permitted within the Service Area.

No Dogs are allowed (except guide dogs). All competitors are responsible for the collection and removal of all rubbish, please use the black bags provided.

The 'bedding in of brakes' and the 'warming of tyres' on any road within the confines of the Service Area is prohibited. First offence, verbal warning from an official and reported to the Clerk of the Course. Second offence carries the penalty of disqualification for the offending competitor.

Note: The only service vehicles permitted to leave the service area during the event will be those of a retired competing crew.



19. INSURANCE

Kingfisher Motorsport Event Road Section Insurance

Vehicles must have a valid motor insurance policy which provides as a minimum Third-Party Liability cover that complies with the Road Traffic Act. This can either be covered by extending an existing motor policy to cover the event, or, by purchasing additional cover provided under the Event Road Section Scheme. If



a competitor has an extension to their existing policy, they will be required to confirm that the motor insurance complies with the requirements of the Road Traffic Act. Any responsibility for a fraudulent or misleading declaration about existing cover lies with the competitor.

Drivers with their own insurance must declare that they have appropriate cover which provides, as a minimum, Third-Party Liability cover and complies with the Road Traffic Act.

The Organisers have applied to Kingfisher for a Blanket Cover Note under the above scheme. This will provide competitors who need to use the scheme with the Third Party Cover necessary to meet RTA requirements on the Road Sections of the event. The cost for this cover will be £40.00

All applicants wishing to use the scheme must be able to comply with all points of the Kingfisher Declaration:

Driver eligibility criteria

- is aged 19 years or over
- · has held a full driving licence for a minimum of 6 months
- has no more than 6 points on their licence
- has had no more than 1 fault claim in the last 3 years
- is a named driver on a valid motor insurance policy for the vehicle they are driving
- do not have the Third-Party Extension cover on their existing motor policy
- the vehicle has a valid MOT and taxed for the road, unless exempt from doing so.

Competitors not meeting the eligibility criteria must obtain a letter of acceptance prior to the event and present evidence of such as the signing on process by sending an email requesting approval by your broker and provide the following information.

- Drivers full name and their date of birth
- Date the driver passed their driving test
- Details of any motoring convictions or claims

Conditions

For this insurance cover to apply, each driver must:

- Have a valid UK driver licence
- Have a valid MSUK or appropriate club membership licence
- Hold a valid motor insurance policy for the vehicle they are driving
- Have officially signed on, met the eligibility criteria of the insurance scheme and paid the premium to the policy holder

Terms of Cover

Driver(s): Any competitor officially signed on with the policy holder to the scheduled event Insured vehicle: The declared vehicle is in the custody and control of the driver who has officially signed on with the policy holder to the scheduled event

Cover: This policy provides Third Party only (unless otherwise stated) road traffic act liability cover throughout the scheduled event

Claims

Claims must be notified to the broker within 48 hours of the finish of the event. The Telephone number is 0333 305 8120

Cover provided by this scheme is only effective whilst the vehicle is actively competing in the event and remains under the control or direction of the event organiser(s). Cover will cease immediately if you are precluded, excluded or retire from the event.

20. DAMAGE/TYRE DECLARATION

- Competitors will be required to comply with (NCR Chapter 13 Appendix 11 Section 14.4 and 14.5)
- A damage declaration must be completed by all crews and handed in at the finish or to the Sweeper car or returned to Rally HQ upon retirement.
- The Maximum tyres permitted for the event will be 10.

21. COMPETITOR LIAISON OFFICER (CLO)

Should you have any difficulty or query with any aspect of the event please bring it to the attention of the Competitor Liaison Officer who can help or resolve a potential problem. A CLO will be available at varying times at the MTC in, and at the finish of the event.

22. **FUEL**

Competitors may use fuel that complies with the Motorsport UK definition of permitted fuel (NCR Appendix 1 Chapter 1 Section 1). This includes the use of FIA specification fuel (FIA Appendix J, article 252, Article 9). NCR Chapter 8 Appendix 1 and 2 also applies.

Competitors are permitted to refuel in the following manner:

- With commercially available pump fuel dispensed from pumps at filling stations marked in the road book.
- 2. Using the dedicated refuelling area in the Service Area.

Refuelling MUST be carried out in accordance with Motorsport UK servicing guidelines, full servicing guidelines will be included with final instructions.

23. SCRUTINEERING AND NOISE

The noise limit for the event is 100db which will be strictly enforced both before the event, at scrutineering and during the event. The Penalty for excessive noise will be disqualification.

Only one scrutineering session is available on Friday 7th November 2025 between 13.00hrs and 18.00hrs. An exception is available for early Saturday morning Scrutineering for a fee of £75.00 which is in addition to the normal entry fee. This £75.00 fee will be donated to the Great Western Air Ambulance by the organisers
